Joined the Varsity team as a freshman-after the consolidation of Sedge Garden and Union Cross High School.

Recognized as one of, if not the first female basketball player In Forsyth County to shoot the revolutionary jump shot (1954).

All-Forsyth County (1956 - 58).

Most Valuable Player (MVP) Forsyth County Tournament (1957).

Scored 64 points against Central Davidson High School which may be the scoring record for female basketball in Forsyth County (1957).

All Conference District (1957, 1958).

Named to the All Northwest team (1957, 1958).

After graduation, the Bobcat forward continued playing basketball in a Commercial Industrial League with some members of the original Hanes Hosiery Women's basketball team and later with McLean Trucking Co., coach by Miles Carter.

Married to Alvin Worrell in 1960, She retired from team sports in 1964 to care for her two daughters Terrie and Beth, they played sports throughout their school years. Mrs. Worrell family is presently involved in sports Mrs. Worrell plays and teaches the game of B-Ball to her grandchildren Bradley, Lindsay, Matthew and Colby.
